ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Start your journey today by applying for NDSU Graduate School by February 15. To qualify, you must hold a bachelor's degree in nursing (BSN), have a current unencumbered registered nurse (RN) license and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

CORE COMPONENTS

- Curriculum completed in eight semesters (three academic years, two summers)
- Clinical placement by NDSU faculty
- >99% pass rate on board certification
