

Peer Education Position Description

Peer Educators are student leaders who are committed to promoting health and wellness on campus. Through peer-led events, presentations, and outreach opportunities, peer educators engage with students to build the knowledge, skills, and behaviors to support overall health and wellness while contributing to the overall well-being of the NDSU community. **All undergraduate and graduate majors are welcome.**

Peer Educator: 5 hours per week **Peer Education LEAD:** 10 hours per week

Responsibilities

- Plan and execute events, awareness campaigns, presentations, and interactive tabling on health and wellness topics for a variety of campus audiences
- Build a working knowledge of wellness topics and campus resources to appropriately educate and refer students
- Serve as leaders, role models, and collaborative partners within the campus community

Both positions share the same core responsibilities in health education, programming, and outreach.

The **Peer Educator** role is great for students who are looking to get involved on campus, support program development and implementation, and grow within the peer education program.

The **Peer Education LEAD** role is designed for Peer Educators who are ready to take on additional responsibilities, including mentoring newer team members, taking a lead role in program planning and event coordination, and serving as a primary point of contact between the team and program supervisors.

- Enrolled NDSU student in good academic and behavioral standing
- Strong communication skills with the ability to create a welcoming environment for all

- Ability to work both independently and collaboratively across diverse groups
- Demonstrates interest in health education, promotion, or peer education
- Exhibits a passion for health and wellness with a willingness to educate on topics such as nutrition, improving mental health, substance use prevention, general well-being and more!

Work Schedule and Hours
