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Early-entry classes allow you to take courses at NDSU while you complete your high-school diploma. Courses can be taken in addition to AP, dual credit, and PSEO. Take these courses to:

- Continue learning in a subject area of interest to you.
- Continue your education and maintain good study habits.
- Get a head start on your degree.

EARLY ENTRY

Earn college credit for the classes you take. You do not need a high-school diploma to apply for this program. You may want to inquire with your school administrator about the possibility of obtaining dual credit for your courses.

Review the list of early-entry classes with your school counselor and parent or guardian to determine which classes are a good fit for you and your intended degree.

EARLY-ENTRY PATHWAYS

We offer early-entry pathways guides to help you choose appropriate classes for your intended degree.

ELIGIBILITY

If you are a student in grades 10, 11, and 12, you may be eligible to take early-entry courses through NDSU. We recommend you have a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Speak with your high-school counselor or teachers to determine your academic readiness to participate in a college-level class.

Early-entry classes have a tuition waiver applied to make these courses affordable. Scholarships may be available to you. Take advantage of this opportunity to get ahead in your degree and save money too!
