- The city of Rolette experienced a decline in population between 1990 and 2000 while Rolette County experienced an increase in population.
- Population projections for Rolette County indicate that population increases are likely to continue over the next two decades.
- The city of Rolette experienced an increase in the proportion of youth under 20 years of age and a decline in the proportion of elderly ages 65 and older between 1990 and 2000. At the same time, Rolette County experienced a decline in the proportion of both youth and elderly. Projections for Rolette County indicate that this loss of youth will likely continue over the next couple decades; however, the proportion of elderly is expected to increase.
- While the white population declined in both the city of Rolette and Rolette County between 1990 and 2000, the American Indian or Alaska Native population increased. In 2000, American Indians comprised one-fourth of the population in the city of Rolette and nearly three-fourths of the population in Rolette County.

- The city of Rolette experienced a slight decline in the total number of housing units between 1990 and 2000 while Rolette County experienced a modest increase in housing units. In 2000, 61 percent of housing units in Rolette County and 52 percent in the city of Rolette were owner-occupied.
- The number of vacant housing units increased slightly in the city of Rolette between 1990 and 2000, while vacant units declined in Rolette County. In 2000, vacant housing comprised 14 percent of all housing in the city of Rolette and 9 percent in Rolette County.
- In 2000, the median value of an owner-occupied home in the city of Rolette was \$43,800, compared to \$55,200 in Rolette County.
- In 2000, half of all housing units in the city of Rolette were built before 1970; half of all housing units in Rolette County were built before 1976.

- The median household income in the city of Rolette was \$27,500 in 2000, compared to \$26,232 in Rolette County. When the 1990 median values are adjusted for inflation, the 2000 median household incomes represent an increase in purchasing power for both the city of Rolette and Rolette County.
- The number and proportion of residents living below poverty increased in the city of Rolette and declined in Rolette County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, 17 percent of residents in the city of Rolette and 31 percent in Rolette County were impoverished.
- The number of impoverished elderly declined in both the city of Rolette and Rolette County between 1990 and 2000. At the same time, the number of impoverished children increased in the city of Rolette and declined in Rolette County. While nearly half of all impoverished residents in both areas were children in 2000, less than 10 percent were elderly.

- Rolette County reported 305 births in 2005, a rate of 22.31 per 1,000 persons. This rate was down from 23.11 in 2004, but up from 19.31 in 2002.
- The number of deaths occurring in Rolette County totaled 130 in 2005, up from 119 in 2002. Major contributors to death were heart disease and cancer.
- The number of foster care placements in Rolette County declined over the last few years. In 2005, the number of foster care placements totaled 96, down from 132 in 2003.

- Total employment declined slightly for the city of Rolette between 1990 and 2000 and increased in Rolette County.
- The percentage of employment that was female increased for both the city of Rolette and Rolette County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, females comprised 54 percent of all employed in the city of Rolette and 53 percent of all employed in Rolette County.
- Both the city of Rolette and Rolette County experienced growth in service industry employment and declines in agricultural and retail trade employment between 1990 and 2000. In addition, Rolette County saw a decline in manufacturing employment during this time period. In 2000, the service sector was the largest industry in both areas, employing 49 percent of workers in Rolette County and 52 percent in the city of Rolette.
