- Both the city of Steele and Kidder County experienced a decline in population between 1990 and 2000.
- Population projections for Kidder County indicate that population declines are likely to continue over the next two decades.
- Both the city of Steele and Kidder County experienced a decline in the proportion of residents younger than 20 years of age between 1990 and 2000 and an increase in the proportion of residents ages 65 and older. Population projections indicate these trends will likely continue in Kidder County over the next two decades.
- There was little change in the racial diversity of Steele and Kidder County between 1990 and 2000; nearly all residents were white.

- While the city of Steele experienced an increase in total housing units between 1990 and 2000, Kidder County saw a decline in housing units. In 2000, 59 percent of housing units in Kidder County and 70 percent in Steele were owner-occupied.
- The city of Steele experienced a decline in vacant housing units between 1990 and 2000 and Kidder County experienced a slight increase in vacant housing. In 2000, vacant housing comprised 7 percent of all housing in Steele and 28 percent in Kidder County.
- In 2000, the median value of an owner-occupied home in the city of Steele was \$55,600, compared to \$33,400 in Kidder County.
- In 2000, half of all housing units in the city of Steele were built before 1969; half of all housing units in Kidder County were built before 1962.

- The median household income in the city of Steele was \$27,841 in 2000, compared to \$25,389 in Kidder County. When the 1990 median values are adjusted for inflation, the 2000 median household incomes represent an increase in purchasing power for the city of Steele and Kidder County.
- The city of Steele experienced an increase in the number and proportion of people living below poverty between 1990 and 2000, while Kidder County saw a decline. In 2000, 14 percent of residents in Steele and 20 percent in Kidder County were impoverished.
- The number of impoverished children declined slightly in the city of Steele and more significantly in Kidder County between 1990 and 2000. At the same time, the number of impoverished elderly increased slightly in Steele and declined in Kidder County. In 2000, children comprised 25 percent of all impoverished residents in Kidder County and 24 percent in Steele. Elderly comprised 27 percent of all impoverished residents in Kidder County and 39 percent in Steele in 2000.

- In 2005, the number of foster care placements for Kidder County was seven, up from one in 2002.

- Total employment increased in the city of Steele between 1990 and 2000 while total employment declined in Kidder County.
- Between 1990 and 2000, the proportion of employment that was female declined in the city of Steele while the proportion increased in Kidder County. In 2000, females comprised 46 percent of all employed in Steele and 43 percent of all employed in Kidder County.
- Both the city of Steele and Kidder County experienced declines in agricultural and retail trade employment between 1990 and 2000 and experienced growth in manufacturing and service industry employment. In 2000, the service sector was the largest industry in Steele, employing 41 percent of workers. In Kidder County, the service industry, which employed 32 percent of workers in 2000, was only slightly larger than agriculture, which employed 30 percent of workers.

- The Steele-Dawson Public School District experienced minor fluctuations in total K-12 enrollment over the past few years, with a total K-12 enrollment of 287 students in 2004-2005.
- In 2004-2005, 68 percent of students in the Steele-Dawson Public School District were proficient or advanced in reading, up from 63 percent in 2001-2002. In addition, 59 percent of students were proficient or advanced in math in 2004-2005, up from 42 percent in 2001-2002.
