NDSU remains deeply committed to its land-grant tradition, and the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station and NDSU Extension Service, with a presence in every county of the state, are integral parts of the university. NDSU also participates in the Tri-College University consortium with the five Fargo-Moorhead colleges and universities, which collectively includes more than 35,000 students.
