- Slowdowns in research productivity
- (Eventually) burnout

Why Mentoring?

- Feedback
- Sponsorship and access to opportunities
- Accountability
- Professional development for career success
- Emotional support
- A sense of intellectual community
- Role models

- Network with faculty across the university


