Who: Anyone interested in <u>doing</u> archaeology! All majors welcome! No prior experience? No problem!

What: NDSU Archaeological Field School (Earn 3 credits over the summer!)

This archaeological project focuses on early farming in the Red River Valley and is located on a division of the original Dalrymple Bonanza Farm. Learn archaeological field and lab methodologies: excavation, mapping, record keeping, photogrammetry, and artifact processing, identification, and cataloging. Work with museum personnel to update an exhibit on local Bonanza farms. Help develop a better understanding of how early white settlers lived in the Dakota Territory.

Students will enroll for ANTH 496: Field Experience. This is a 3 credit course. No prior experience is needed!

When: M-F, 9am-5pm; May 28th – June 28th Reach out to inquire about schedule accommodations.

Students are expected to be on-site or in the lab (depending on the class schedule) from M-F 9am-5pm for the entire 5 weeks of the field school.
